Submission		
At least 80% of classrooms and 70% of students are participating in Crunch&Sip® everyday

Role modelling		
Teachers and staff role model eating fruit and vegetables and drinking water inside and outside of the classroom		
Parents are encouraged to model appropriate consumption of fruit and water when participating in school activities such as excursions and camps.		
Other issues to consider		
Students are encouraged to drink plain water during break times, sports, excursions and camps.		
Students attending excursions and camps are required to bring a water bottle.		
A plan is in place to monitor the fruit and water policy.
